To solve this problem, Developments in Literacy (DIL) educates underserved children, especially young girls, in affordable, student-centered schools across Pakistan, empowering them to live their dreams. DIL also provides professional development to teachers and principals, improving the quality of education nationwide.

DIL educates children in 191 schools, 56% of which are government schools, by:

- using technology to improve clear understanding and application of new concepts
- undertaking continuous assessment of student learning to generate successful outcomes
- preparing students for future academic pursuits through programs that offer life skill training, scholarships, and mentorship.

DIL's TEaM (Teacher Education and Management) College furnishes continuous education to DIL and non-DIL school faculty and staff through a synthesis of:

- pedagogical training
- management training
- ongoing assessment of teachers.


On The Horizon
